A few members met at Box Village Hall for a pleasant afternoon's sketching.

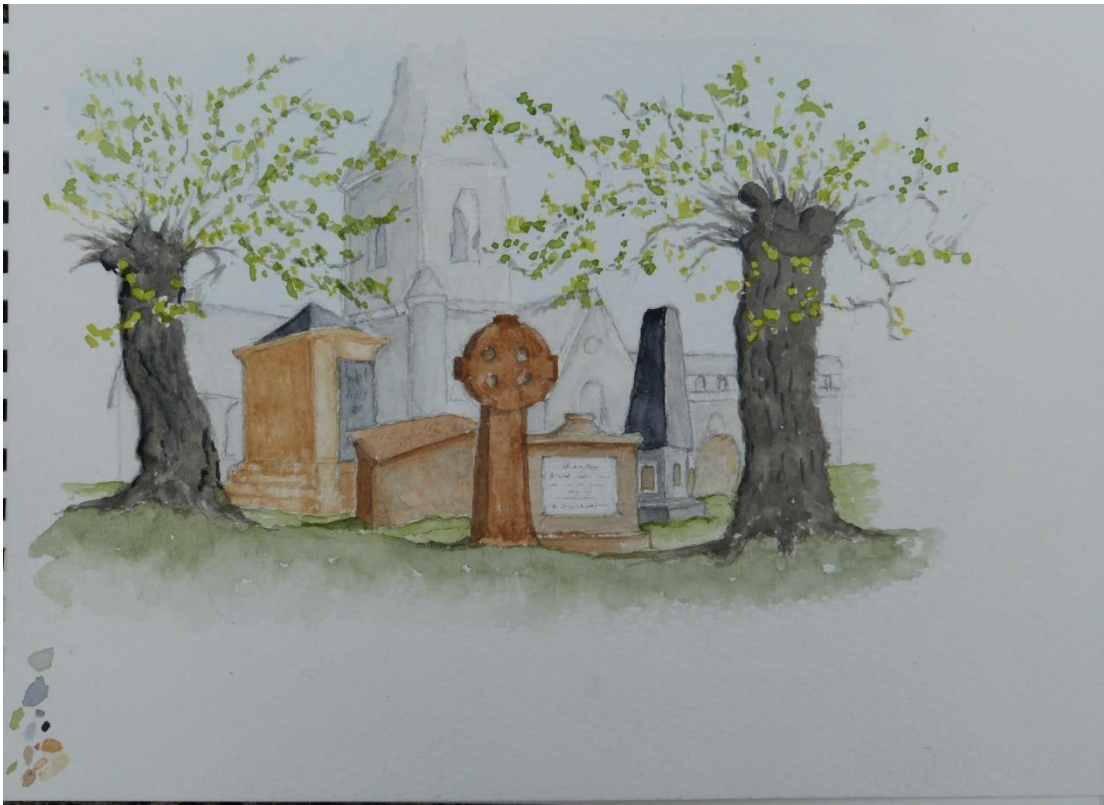

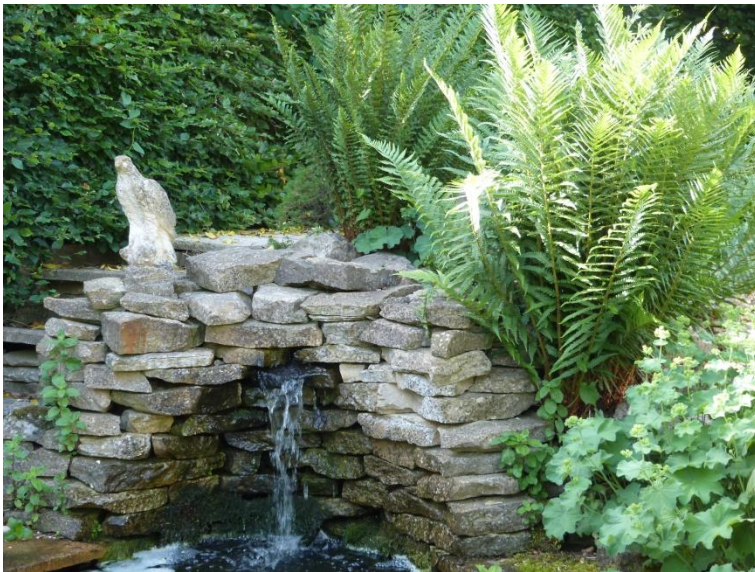

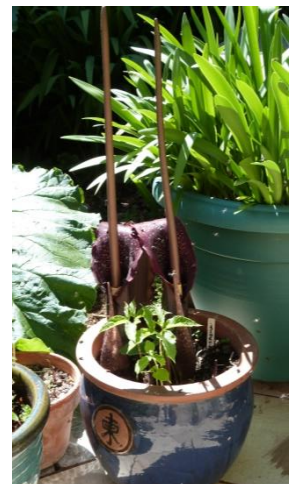
The 'scent' on Wednesday when the *arisaema* opened was not something to write home about, but the flies love it! (I'm not sure of the species, so any suggestions welcome.)
